Community Wildfire Defense Grant (CWDG)



What is it? Implementation of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) to provide \$1B over a 5-year period (approximately \$200M per year) to communities at risk of wildfire to 1) develop/revise their Community Wildfire Protection Plans (CWPP) and/or 2) implement mitigation activities identified within their CWPPs. See USDA Forest Service - CWDG for additional details.

Who is eligible to apply? Communities at risk of wildfire, including local governments, non-profit organizations, HOAs, Tribes and State Forestry agencies.

How are competitive funds prioritized? By areas identified as having high or very high wildfire hazard potential, low-income communities, or communities impacted by a severe disaster (within the last 10 years).

How to submit a grant application? Applicants will need to complete and submit an online grant proposal through forestrygrants.org once the application period is open. Contact Shauna Morris at shauna.morris@odf.oregon.gov for a unique application link for EACH grant proposal. The guidance for the 2024 application period is not expected to change a great deal, but please be sure to refer to the most up-to-date NOFO.

Round 3 is tentatively scheduled to open for applications Fall 2024
